Under the Companies Act 1981 of Bermuda ("Companies Act"), share premium is distributable to shareholders, subject to the condition that the Company cannot declare or pay a dividend, or make a distribution out of share premium and other reserves if (i) it is, or would after the payment be, unable to pay its liabilities as they become due, or (ii) the realisable value of its assets would thereby be less than the aggregate of its liabilities and its issued share capital account.

As stipulated by the relevant laws and regulations for foreign investment enterprises in the People's Republic of China (the "PRC"), the Company's PRC subsidiaries are required to maintain two statutory reserves, being an enterprise expansion fund and a statutory surplus reserve fund which are non-distributable. Appropriations to such reserves are made out of net profit after taxation reported in the statutory financial statements of the PRC subsidiaries while the amounts and allocation basis are decided by their respective boards of directors annually. The statutory surplus reserve fund can be used to make up their prior year losses, if any, and can be applied in conversion into capital by means of capitalisation issue. The enterprise expansion fund can be used for expanding the capital base of the PRC subsidiaries by means of capitalisation issue.

On 30 September 2017, Mr. Hung Yung Lai, being the Chairman, executive director and controlling shareholder of the Company, waived the balance due to him of approximately RMB786,000. The amount has been capitalised as shareholder's contribution.

#### 1. GENERAL

The unaudited consolidated interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the applicable disclosure requirements set out in Chapter 18 of the GEM Listing Rules and International Accounting Standards ("IAS") 34 "Interim Financial Reporting" issued by the International Accounting Standards Board ("IASB").

The unaudited consolidated interim financial statements do not include all the information and disclosures required in the annual financial statements, and should be read in conjunction with the Group's annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2018.

The unaudited consolidated interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS") issued by the IASB, the disclosure requirements of the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance and the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on GEM.

The unaudited consolidated interim financial statements are presented in Renminbi ("RMB"), which is the same as the functional currency of the Group.

All significant intra-group transactions and balances have been eliminated on consolidation.

The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those followed in the preparation of the Group's annual consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2018 (the "2018 Consolidated Financial Statements"), except for the amendments and interpretations of IFRSs (the "New IFRSs") issued by IASB which have become effective in this period as detailed in the notes of the 2018 Consolidated Financial Statements. The adoption of the New IFRSs has no material impact on the accounting policies in the Group's condensed consolidated financial statements for the period.

#### 2. REVENUE AND SEGMENT INFORMATION

Information reported to the Company's executive directors, being the chief operating decision maker ("CODM"), for the purposes of resource allocation and assessment of segment performance focuses on types of goods or services delivered or provided.

Hangzhou Singlee Technology Company Limited ("Singlee Technology"), a subsidiary of the Company, was established in Hangzhou, the PRC, with statutory tax rate of 25%. Singlee Technology is regarded as a High and New Technology Enterprise defined by Zhejiang Finance Bureau, Administrator of Local Taxation of Zhejiang Municipality and Zhejiang Municipal office of the State Administration of Taxation and is therefore entitled to 15% preferential tax rate for the PRC EIT since 2010. Accordingly, the tax rate for Singlee Technology is 15% for the six months ended 30 June 2019 and 2018.

According to the PRC Enterprise Income Tax Law, the applicable tax rate of Hangzhou Singlee Software Company Limited ("Singlee Software") and Xin Yintong Technology Co., Ltd. ("Xin YinTong") is 25% for the six months ended 30 June 2019 and 2018.

No provision for Hong Kong Profits Tax has been made as the Group had no estimated assessable profits arising from Hong Kong during the six months ended 30 June 2019 and 2018.

PRC enterprise income tax has not been provided as the Group had no estimated assessable profits arising from PRC for the six months ended 30 June 2019 (six months ended 30 June 2018: Nil).

On 21 May 2019, the Company completed the issue of 439,080,000 rights shares to the qualifying shareholders, on the basis of one rights share (the "Rights Share") for every two existing Shares held on 24 April 2019 at the subscription price of HK\$0.06 per Rights Share (the "Rights Issue"). The net proceeds from Rights Issue raised by the Company was approximately HK\$24,420,000 (equivalent to approximately RMB21,564,000).

As a result of the Rights Issue, the Company's issued Shares increased to 1,317,240,000 Shares accordingly.

## MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

#### Financial review and results of operations

For the six months ended 30 June 2019, the Group recorded a total revenue of approximately RMB44,040,000, an increase of 33% as compared to the same period of last year (For the six months ended 30 June 2018: approximately RMB33,107,000). The increase in the turnover of the Group was mainly attributable to the increase in the revenue of the Group's provision of technical support services. Cost of sales for the six months ended 30 June 2019 increased by 17% to approximately RMB32,746,000 (For the six months ended 30 June 2018: approximately RMB27,937,000). Cost of sales increased in line with business activities. The Group's gross profit ratio is 26% (For the six months ended 30 June 2018: 16%).

Administrative expenses for the six months ended 30 June 2019 decreased by 32% to approximately RMB6,626,000 (For the six months ended 30 June 2018: approximately RMB9,700,000). The decrease in administrative expenses was mainly due to the decrease in recognition of share options expenses when compared to the same period of last year and our effective cost control measures. For the distribution and selling expenses, it is increased by 18% to RMB7,429,000 (For the six months ended 30 June 2018: approximately RMB6,299,000), The increase in distribution and selling expenses was mainly due to the increased in staff costs to cope with the needs for business expansion. Other income included refund of value added tax and interest income; and other gains and losses included exchange differences and fair value changes in financial assets at fair value through profit or loss.

Finance costs for the six months ended 30 June 2019 increased by 17% to approximately RMB1,321,000 (For the six months ended 30 June 2018: approximately RMB1,130,000). The increase in finance costs was mainly attributable to the recognition of interest expenses of lease liabilities due to adoption of IFRS16.

The Group recorded a loss of approximately RMB3,075,000 for the six months ended 30 June 2019, decrease of 75% as compared to the same period of last year (For the six months ended 30 June 2018: net loss approximately RMB12,304,000). Decrease in loss was primarily attributable to increase in turnover and our effective cost control measures.

No equity-settled share-based payment was recognised for the six months ended 30 June 2019 (For the six months ended 30 June 2018: approximately RMB790,000).

We will continue striving our best to increase sales and strengthen our cost control measures. With the products of our Group becoming more mature in the market and the effective cost control, we expect that financial results of the group would be further improved in the coming quarter.

## **BUSINESS REVIEW**

### Overall Business of the Group for the first half of 2019

Since the implementation of the strategy of one core business and two complementary products in 2017, the Group has been enhancing and meticulously executing the overall strategy. Hence, it registered a net profit of RMB22,203,000 in 2018, representing a year-on-year increase of 41% and an increasingly evident of success in the transformation of Sing Lee Group. Due to the investment without significant income in the suppliers by the banking industry in the first half of the year, the Group performed well, with a 33% increase in sales and just a 17% increase in the cost of sales in the first half of the year, facing requirements of the overall strategic development in the next three years, there was an unavoidable increase in cost of sales, thus leading to losses, which decreased by 75% as compared with the same period in 2018. This was obviously attributable to the overall strategic development of one core business and two complementary products.

Driven by the normalization of structural reforms in the financial environment and the continuous adjustment of relevant markets, the continuous growth of capital products not only highlights the clear path of product research, development and marketing, but also reflects customers' recognition of the Group's relevant products. This was proven by the cooperation with leading urban commercial banks in China, such as Bank of Beijing, Bank of Shanghai, Bank of Jiangsu and Bank of Nanjing. The State's continuous liberation of regional banks resulted in a greater use of the Group's existing customers and market shares to pursue a rapid development of the Group's own brands and collaborative projects. The Group entered into investment cooperation agreements with regional banks, such as Chinese Merchandise Bank, Zaozhuang Bank and Z-Bank, during the second quarter, such that a sales model of "flexible business portfolio" of the products on the whole was formed with the help of small, mid-sized and large urban commercial banks. "Payment plus service" 1 – Payment: Payment has become a popular product, as a result of diversification of payment forms due to cooperative promotion by banks and third parties, as well as increasingly accelerated maturity. Meanwhile, online and offline payment modes emerged one after another. The unconscious payment method in which the Group and China Construction Bank cooperated has been adopted in Home Inns Group, while there is an opportunity for business model transformation to cooperative operation with regard to the collection and payment agency platform jointly developed with China Citic Bank, in addition to the development of new business models. Due to the great development potential of the payment market and based on the knowledge of Sing Lee about the industry, continuously developing the market through transformation and innovation will be the future direction of the company.

"Payment plus service" 2 – Service: Development of offline markets and targeted development of merchant service businesses have become one of the main objectives of the Group. The Group increased the number of banks served from only two provincial branch banks 5 years ago to a number of banks in 13 provinces including Zhejiang, Jiangsu, Guangdong and other economic powerhouses in the first half of the year. Therefore, the Group's services will further reflect the operation project of deepening value-added services and strengthening of the cooperation with banks with a focus on merchants and cardholders, where divided businesses will be gradually combined to integrate banking outsourcing service products (merchant) and payment products, and business portfolio will become the focus of future development.

In spite of the declining performance of various industries due to the trade war between China and the United States, Sing Lee Group achieved better results under pressure in the previous year, which sufficiently shows the clear strategy of the Board of Directors and the effective execution by the management team.

## **FUTURE OUTLOOK**

While the discussion about the cooperation of payment and credit risk control products with banks began, the payment plus outsourcing service, business platform evolved from traditional operations and "Bank-School Express" remain our main sources of big data. With the help of these products, the Group will form a unique OFFLINE TO ONLINE (O2O) model. We also plan to extend the collaborative model with banks to other commercial banks. Meanwhile, the business portfolio will be better aligned to the overall development of the financial environment.

# LIQUIDITY, FINANCIAL RESOURCES AND GEARING RATIO

The operating expenditures of the Group are funded by cash flow from operations, the net proceeds from the Rights Issue on 21 May 2019 and borrowings. The Group has adequate sources of funds to meet its future working capital requirements.

As at 30 June 2019, the Group held cash and cash equivalents denominated in RMB, US dollars and HK dollars, amounted to approximately RMB24,542,000 (31 December 2018: approximately RMB45,648,000). The Group's current ratio, based on total current assets over total current liabilities, as at 30 June 2019 was approximately 3.3 times (31 December 2018: approximately 2.5 times).

Total staff costs for the reported period were approximately RMB28,817,000 (six months ended 30 June 2018: approximately RMB21,258,000).

The Group has adopted a share option scheme whereby certain employees of the Group granted options to acquire shares.

## **CHARGE ON GROUP ASSETS**

As at 30 June 2019, certain properties of the Group located in Hangzhou with an aggregate net carrying amount of approximately RMB10,265,000 (31 December 2018: approximately RMB10,539,000) were used to secure the banking facilities.

## **RIGHTS ISSUE IN MAY 2019**

During the six months ended 30 June 2019, the Company proposed a rights issue of 439,080,000 rights issue shares at HK\$0.06 per rights issue share on the basis of 1 rights issue share for every 2 shares held by shareholders. Details of the rights issue are set out in the circular of the Company dated 25 April 2019.

The rights issue was completed on 21 May 2019 and the net proceed of approximately HK\$24,420,000 (equivalent to approximately RMB21,564,000) was raised. Up to the date of this report, a total of approximately HK\$5,700,000 (equivalent to approximately RMB5,033,000) was paid for general working capital, which was applied consistently with the intended uses previously disclosed in the circular of the Company dated 25 April 2019. The remaining of approximately HK\$18,720,000 (equivalent to approximately HK\$18,720,000 (equivalent to approximately RMB16,531,000) will be utilized as intended.

## NOMINATION COMMITTEE

The Company established a nomination committee in March 2012. The principal duties of the nomination committee are to formulate nomination policy and make recommendation to the Board on nomination and appointment of the directors and board succession; formulate and review the Board Diversity Policy. The chairman of the nomination committee is Mr. Hung Yung Lai and other members include Mr. Pao Ping Wing, Mr. Thomas Tam and Mr. Lo King Man.

## AUDIT AND RISK MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Company established an audit and risk management committee on 27 August 2001 with written terms of reference in compliance with Rules 5.28 to 5.33 of the GEM Listing Rules. The primary duties of the audit and risk management committee are to review and supervise the financial reporting process, internal control procedures and risk management system of the Group. The chairman of the audit and risk management committee is Mr. Pao Ping Wing and other members include Mr. Thomas Tam and Mr. Lo King Man, all of them are independent non-executive directors.

The Group's unaudited results for the six months ended 30 June 2019 have been reviewed by the audit and risk management committee, which was of the opinion that the preparation of such results complied with the applicable accounting standards and requirements and that adequate disclosures have been made.
